



Snuggle up and read with your baby right from the start. Read books you have at home and find more at your local library!

Read to a newborn baby? YES! It's never too early to start reading aloud! Developing language and literacy skills begins at birth through everyday loving interactions like talking and sharing books. If you speak a language other than English, the best way to support your baby's language development is to talk and read in your home language. It's easy to read a book to your baby in any language by just talking about the pictures.

Keep it fun! When reading to your baby, you don't need to read all the words in the book, or even look at all the pages. Looking at the pictures and pointing things out is a wonderful way to begin to share books with your baby! If your baby isn't in the mood to listen and is fussy, just try again later. Enjoy this time together.

Read anything! In the earliest days of infancy, you can read anything to your baby. Your baby doesn't understand the words you read, but he or she feels safe in your loving arms, hearing the familiar

sound of your voice. Reading and sharing interesting words with your baby will help him begin a lifetime of loving books.

Books to chew on. Before you know it your baby will begin to explore her world by putting everything in her mouth, including books! Opening and closing books, holding them, and chewing on them, are all part of how books become familiar and treasured objects for babies.




How to choose a book. Look for small, sturdy, board books that have lots of rhythm and rhyme and pictures that show recognizable objects and faces of people. You'll want to avoid books with too much text or ones where the pictures are too small. Once a baby is more aware of what is around him and can hold objects, he's ready for books that relate to his world and introduce words and concepts in a fun way.
